I've just returned home from a very vibrant and exciting weekend of music, song and dance at the Auckland Folk Festival (AFF) which always has a lively dance programme complementing the music programme. Virelai – a Danish Medieval Group led several early Danish dances to fabulous music. They were a hit with everyone and especially the younger contingent of dancers. The final night of the festival saw upwards of 50 young people between 15 - 30yrs dancing from midnight until almost dawn (or they would have if the musicians hadn't stopped at 4.00am). A smattering of 'more mature' dancers joined in and enjoyed the vigour of youth on the dance floor! Who says young people don't want to folk dance.!....This year many FDNZ members were leading workshops. The Kids Zone was particularly fun with Rae's colourful maypole, and myself and Jane taking the 'Kid's Dance' for the littlies - the children really enjoyed it. Last year (2018) the Auckland Multicultural Society Inc. (AMS Inc.) celebrated their 40th Anniversary under the leadership of President Mr Thuten Kesang representative of the Tibetan Community. To mark this significant Anniversary AMS Inc created a hand printed mural 2.5 metres long by 2 metres wide (see over) with the hand prints of ethnic dance and performance groups that have supported AMS Inc. at the Lakeside Multicultural Festival. Some groups have supported this event for the last 21 years!! For the last three years AMS Inc has been working on publishing a compilation of articles from Newsletters - . Title: Uniting Our Cultures - The History of Auckland Multicultural Society Inc. Part Two. The first part presented a compilation of articles relating to the organisation from 1978 to 2000. After this event the Society will distribute free copies to the National Library, local Schools and Libraries for general access. Other AMS Inc events to look out for in 2019 are:

DANCING....IN A LOFT... Maggie Quinlan (President

Ruritanian International Folk Dance Club) attends weekly folk dance classes in Rae Storey's loft - proving you can dance anywhere ... For many years Rae Storey, a founder member of the Ruritanian International Folk Dance Group, has held classes on Mondays and Fridays in a church hall in Remuera, Auckland. A few years ago, when their carport and a big tree succumbed to mutual destruction, Rae, and her husband Jack, built in their place a garage with a loft, the big room (5mx4.5m) a sunny rumpus room-cum-mini dance studio. When the dance classes numbers declined, the dance studio was the ideal solution. It will take about 6 or 7 people, even bouncing around in Israeli numbers.

Many of the dancers have been dancing for many years, but there are newcomers and together we enjoy dancing and socialising. We are very privileged to have Rae's wealth of experience in teaching, as we dance old and learn new dances from all over the world, particularly Europe.

Getting to know the names of the dances, with their backgrounds and meanings are part of the learning, as well as the different choreographic interpretations. We even have a lending library, where books can be passed on after reading!

It's fun; it's friendly; it's good healthy exercise, statistically proven to ward off dementia! Why not come along? We welcome all.
